September 8, 2008

- All members were present.
- Mr. Robinson called the meeting to order.

- The council started their annual policy review. It will be continued for the next few months.

- One council member questioned whether or not the soccer boosters might be allowed to use the concession stand in the football building instead of the red trailer furnished by Coca Cola.
- Another council member wanted to be updated on the issue of our school resource officer—whether or not grants have been made available. Mr. Robinson indicated that Superintendent Anderson and Sheriff Clemons are still working on a plan.
